COPYRIGHT (ROME CONVENTION) ORDER, 1994

Authority:

This order was made on 29th July, 1994 by the Minister under section 50 of the Copyright Act.

Commencement:

13th October, 1994.

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Copyright (Rome Convention) Order, 1994.
- 2. For the purposes of this order "Rome Convention" means the International Convention for the Protection of Performers, Producers of Phonograms and Broadcasting Organisations done at Rome on the 26th day of October, 1961.
 - 3. The protection accorded under the Copyright Act
 - (a) to a performer who is a citizen of Barbados or who is a permanent resident of Barbados within the meaning of the *Immigration Act* with respect to performances taking place, broadcast or fixed in Barbados;

- (b) to a producer of phonograms who is a citizen or who is a permanent resident of Barbados within the meaning of the *Immigration Act*; and
- (c) to a broadcasting organisation licensed under any enactment in force in Barbados with respect to broadcasts transmitted from transmitters situated in Barbados.

are accorded to performers, producers of phonograms, sound recordings and broadcasting organisations referred to in paragraph 4.

4. The following are the performers, producers of phonograms, sound recordings and broadcasting organisations referred to in paragraph 3

- (a) performers who are citizens or residents of a country, other than Barbados, that has acceded to the Rome Convention with respect to performances taking place, broadcast or first fixed in a Contracting State of the Rome Convention;
- (b) producers of phonograms who are citizens or residents of a country, other than Barbados, that has acceded to the Rome Convention;
- (c) sound recordings first fixed or first published, in a country, other than Barbados that has acceded to the Rome Convention; and
- (d) broadcasting organisations registered in a country, other than Barbados, that has acceded to the Rome Convention with respect to broadcasts transmitted from transmitters situated in a Contracting State of the Rome Convention.
